

Tell me about the Co-Ownership Draw



How can my application get into the draw?

Qualifying periods for receipt of application forms to go forward into the draw will be published in advance.

All application forms received during the qualifying period for the draw will be entered. Applications will then be drawn out at random until there are sufficient complete applications to fill the quota.

There may be more than one draw needed to fill a quota. It depends on how many applications are received and how quickly. That is why there is a qualifying period for entry to the draw.

What if my application isn't picked in the draw – do I have another opportunity?

There is no carry forward of forms from one draw into another. For each draw there is a qualifying period, when forms can be received. To go into a later draw, you will need to re-apply within that qualifying period. Applicants who are unsuccessful in one draw have an opportunity to do so, if they wish.

Can I send in more than one application at the one time?

If an applicant is connected with more than one application form received, each of the applications involved will be cancelled and, if one or any are part of a quota, they will be removed.

How can I be sure the draw is not biased?

The draw will take place in public in our office reception area (where applications are received) and will be carried out by an independent professional.

There is no way of knowing anything about the application at the time of the draw. On receipt, every application form is given its own unique number. It is this number that goes into the draw, not the application itself or any identifying information.

Every application received during the qualifying period will go forward into the draw.

Will there always be a draw?

At times when there are more hopeful applicants than we may be able to help through the Co-Ownership Scheme, the draw is a means of ensuring that everyone has a similar chance. Should circumstances change, there may be no need for a draw.
